THE KITCHEN IS THE HEART OF THE HOME...

<p>White Hollow Road, Sharon <i>This large Georgian home is most notable for its beautifully landscaped grounds.</i> Designed by Leslie and Robert Rylee, both house and gardens have been designed in a neo-classical style with keen attention to architectural details. The kitchen elements provide an interplay between past and present with ornate steel cabinets mirroring the metal illusion of the zinc countertop, a modern marble-topped kitchen table, salvaged antique pocket doors, ornate glass drawer pulls, Robin egg blue walls, and silver accents.</p>	<p>Salmon Kill Road, Salisbury** <i>Designed by Lisa Foster of Nest, this spacious, sophisticated kitchen is perfect for entertaining a crowd!</i> A massive marble-topped kitchen island with endless storage space, 6-burner Viking stove, Sub-Zero fridge and two original Shaw porcelain sinks and a wine storage cooler in the bar allow two or three chefs to cook comfortably. Grass cloth wallpaper adds texture and warmth to the walls. Hitchcock chairs surround the large dining table. This kitchen is abundant in elegance!</p>	<p>Wells Hill Road, Lakeville <i>This newly-constructed Federal Farmhouse with 5,000 square feet of living space feels like it's been around for more than a century.</i> With long sweeping views of the Litchfield Hills and abundant light streaming in throughout the house, you'll want to stay home forever. The kitchen features black granite counter tops, custom cabinets and salvaged antique doors. A large butler's pantry and antique pocket doors to the dining area set the tone for this formal kitchen.</p>
<p>Lime Rock Road, Lakeville <i>Just featured in the NEW YORK TIMES! Mid-century modern architecture expresses the organic forms of nature, but in a refined manner.</i> Husband and wife team, Pilar Proffitt and Robert Bristow, achieved this aesthetic by blending mid-century modern with minimalist design to construct this unique and spacious kitchen. A floor to ceiling stone fireplace graces the middle of this light flooded abode. Dark stained American block front cabinets set against a white background offer a refreshing departure from more traditional cabinets.</p>	<p>Great Elm, Sharon <i>Located on the ground level of Great Elm, a mansion built in the mid 1700s</i> and cleverly divided into five condominiums in 1983, this small but efficient kitchen, designed by Tom Vigeant, has a wonderful black and white porcelain floor reminiscent of early 1900 tile floors, black and white granite countertops, and a tall, slim Sub-Zero fridge with custom wood panels that match the painted cabinets. Unusual roll-up blinds and graphic artwork add to the visual appeal of this kitchen.</p>	<p>Lakefront Cottage, Lakeville <i>This lakefront home is the quintessence of relaxation.</i> New York interior designer Amie Weitzman transformed this older cedar-shingled home into a modern retreat where she and her family can watch the sailboats drift by while eating breakfast in this very hip kitchen. Two large silver pendant lights make a statement in this open spacious kitchen where the family lounges around the teak wood island. Two apron front sinks and a large 4-burner Wolfe stove in between allow for comfortable and efficient cooking.</p>
<p>Route 41, Sharon* <i>This newly constructed kitchen leads out to a large deck with breathtaking views of Silver Lake.</i> Designed by Joan Osofsky, Wanda Furman and Camilla Mathlien of Hammertown Barn, this kitchen features Caesar stone countertops, painted wood cabinets, wood floors stained in a light driftwood finish and the famous Farrow and Ball paint colors gracing the walls. A combination of modern and classic design define this small but efficient kitchen and home, where you will find Hammertown's signature style throughout.</p>	<p>Victorian Farmhouse, Sharon <i>Built in 1908, with sweeping views of Indian Mountain, this highly functional and spacious kitchen was designed to look like it has always been part of the house.</i> The 2010 renovation includes an addition that provides a built-in eating area and a screened-in porch. An extra long and narrow island with a Caesar stone counter provides a convenient place to have a cup of tea, close to the large Blue Star stove and the walk-in pantry. The adjoining mud room contains a washer-dryer area and ample cabinet space for storage.</p>	<p>Hilltop House, Sharon* <i>This dream home was designed complete with indoor lap pool, 1950s diner booth, and an artist's studio with spectacular views of the Catskills.</i> Cooking takes the back burner in this kitchen. While it is efficient, the artist confesses that the view and the guests take priority here, which is why the living room and kitchen are open to each other. Enjoy the blazing fireplace while lounging at the island or booth. Admire the magnificent wildlife artwork on the walls executed by the owner of this magnificent hilltop retreat!</p>
